

After successfully launching the **Montana Playwrights Network** in 2017 with **free workshops** around the State and the **Montana Playwrights Conference** in Helena; in 2018, MPN is working on the following:

Staff with the Verge Theater in Bozeman and the Montana Playwrights Network are working out details of a partnership event scheduled for 2018. After the parameters are finalized, we'll share the specifics. Meanwhile, the Verge has sent out a call to Montana playwrights to submit original works to be considered for workshopping, staged readings and full productions. Plays selected for workshops and staged readings will automatically be considered for full productions in a future season. Deadline for consideration for summer, 2018, is March 1. In Helena, MPN will offer a two-part event, "The 2018 Playwrights Challenge". The first part is a get-together social event in May, followed by an informative discussion about work-shopping processes used in new play development, and then closes with a presentation outlining the terms of the 2018 Playwrights Challenge. Next, we'll follow up in September by presenting staged readings of original scripts generated in the Playwrights Challenge process.
